Welcome to the 2010 edition of The Chas. C. Hart Seed Co.'s Bulk Flower & Vegetable Seed Catalog. We have an extensive selection of open-pollinated & hybrid vegetable seeds perfectly suited for growing & producing here in New England, as well as across the country. With the exception of Jetstar Tomato our inventory consists of untreated seed.


Despite a reduction in pressure for acreage (as demand for corn for ethanol decreased) and a drop in fuel cost, last year proved to be difficult for growers for an entirely different reason. Recession and Victory Gardens became popular, driving up demand. The news of more food scares and the desire to save money while providing healthy, home-grown veggies brought many first-time gardeners into the mix. As a result stocks were depleted and demand for acreage increased. Peas, Beans, Corn and Onions were affected the hardest as a percentage.

Established in 1892 by Mr. Charles C. Hart, one of America's pioneer seedsmen, The Chas. C. Hart Seed Co. is still proudly owned & operated by 4th & 5th generations of the Hart family.

Ageratum *A. houstonianum*

Compact mounds covered with clusters of fluffy blossoms, that are popular for borders. Prefers full sun, but will tolerate light shade. Suitable for dried or fresh flowers. 188,500 seeds/oz.

Blue Mink (OP)(A) Early, large powder blue flowers on stocky plants. Leaves and flowers are larger than most other varieties. 6 to 8 inches.

Alyssum *Lobularia ssp.*

Spreading plants with tiny flowers bloom from late spring until frost if spent blossoms are trimmed back. Will tolerate light shade. Excellent for rock gardens & borders. Prefers well-drained soil. Plant mid-May to July. 29,000 seeds/oz.

Amaranthus *A. caudatus*

Love-Lies-Bleeding (A) A fast-growing annual, 3-5ft. tall, which may require staking in exposed areas. Long, weeping, wine-red trusses of flowers and seeds 18in. long drapes towards the ground. The tassels may be dried and used in autumn arrangements. Young leaves may be sautéed like spinach and eaten. Originating in the Incan Empire, Amaranthus has been grown as a grain for over 4000 years. It was used in ancient religious ceremonies and worn by knights to symbolize purity and truth.

Plentiful masses of star-shaped, small flowers of the clearest possible blue with deeper blue veins and a pale eye. Tolerate sun and shade, easily grown in almost all soils and climates. 1 to 2 feet. 44,000 seeds/oz.

Opens in the evening to the following morning and fill the air with an intoxicating fragrance. Will not bloom until evenings become warm. Vines grow to 11ft. or more.

Planting Vegetables in Early Winter for an Early Spring Crop

Gardeners living in temperate zones often feel that vegetables can only be planted during the frost-free periods. However, some of the cold hardy vegetables can be planted up to six weeks prior to the average last killing spring frost. Certain vegetables also can be planted late in the fall and in the winter months in these Temperate Zone climates to take advantage of their early spring germination and development. These cool season vegetables include lettuce, peas, spinach, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, carrots, radish & cauliflower.

Potatoes and other tubers and roots may freeze and rot during the winter. Hence, the planting of these crops is not recommended in this manner.

Tomato, squash, pumpkin and several other warm season crops frequently germinate early in the spring from fruit left in the garden from the previous fall. These 'naturally' seeded vegetables harden off quickly in the spring and are remarkably capable of withstanding freezing temperatures. They often out-produce expensive store-bought transplants set out after the last killing spring frost. Cool season crops seeded prior to or during the winter germinate in the spring based on soil and air temperature not the whim and fancy of the gardener.

Cool-season vegetables seeded too late in the spring are more susceptible to disease problems. A prime example is the powdery mildew that attacks peas during hot weather. Peas also yellow during these hot periods. Lettuce, spinach and Chinese cabbage that is not planted early enough to take advantage of the cool spring will often bolt (form a seed stalk) when hot weather arrives. Radish planted during the heat will typically bolt instead of developing an enlarged root. Planting in the fall just before the ground freezes allows these cold-hardy vegetables the opportunity to develop early in the spring when soil and air temperatures are ideal for this category of vegetable.

How to do it

In the fall, after the garden has been cleared of all dead non-decomposed plant material (add this to the compost pile), till the garden area and mark the rows as if you were going to seed. Just before the ground freezes (or after if necessary) seed the desired cold-hardy vegetables, cover with soil from the garden or potting soil (if the garden soil is frozen). Cover the seed as directed on the package. A layer of straw or hay mulch or even shredded leaves (as long as they do not pack down) will help keep the ground frozen and maintain moisture through the winter. A good inch of mulch is sufficient. Even small seedlings like carrots will come through 1 inch of mulch. The mulch will settle so by spring the inch that was applied will probably be about ½ inch thick. In areas where wind is a problem, mulch can be held in place with chicken wire or boughs broken from used Christmas trees. After the mulch is in place, soak the seeded area to provide sufficient moisture for germination.

Guideline for Successful Seed Sowing

Sow seed in a light, well-drained soil. Seeds need air as well as water to germinate. Sow no deeper than 2 to 3 times the diameter or length of the seed. Very fine seed should be sown on the surface. Most seed requires constant moisture to germinate. Also pay strict attention to temperature requirements for different varieties. **Failures in seed germination are almost always caused by improper attention to cultural requirements.** The most common causes of seed failure are sowing the seed in cold, soggy soil, heavily waterlogged soil, cold soil, or in soil that has been allowed to dry out. For starting seed indoors, use of seed starting soil is recommended.
